## FROM THE RABBI Esther Hugenholtz

I'll tell you a little secret. When I'm leading the Conservative morning service and I'm chanting through Pesukei d'Zimra, the preliminary service that consists mainly of Psalms, I often stop and linger over a few verses in English. The beauty of the Psalms never fails to arrest me, not just because of their literary value but mainly because of their emotional weight. Psalms are meant to be emotional; they pull our heartstrings by design. Reading Psalms as the outpouring of the human soul can really shift their meaning, especially if you allow a verse to jump out at you and weave commentary on your own life.

Such a Psalm that has been doing that for me lately is Psalm 23 and the words 'kosi revayah' – 'my cup overflows'. It's a complex image: is the overflow positive or negative? Do our lives feel full or overwhelming? What are the blessings of abundance and what are the challenges? I am contemplating these words as I reflect on the fullness of my own life. I have so much to be grateful for: serving the congregation, seeing my tomatoes ripen on the vine and my growing family. I am particularly grateful for the support and generosity so many of you have shown our family in the wake of the Sisterhood Baby Shower – despite my third pregnancy, my first ever Shower, yet another American milestone in my life! I am also very grateful for our new Synagogue President, Sue Weinberg, and our Board. We have experienced the fullness in meeting with different committee chairs, planning for the future and bouncing around ideas. Sue's strategic mind will be focusing on creating productive overlap between the different committees – this synergy will allow us to work closer together within our community. I am very excited about what is to come.

I am also very grateful to our Religion School Principal, Sonja Spear. Her intelligence and devotion to the wellbeing of our children make this a wonderful partnership. I am excited for some curricular innovations that Sonja is introducing this coming Fall. Sonja will also be leading an Adult Education program on Jewish-Christian interfaith relations where she will present her own scholarship – it will be worth attending!

My cup overflows when it comes to the wider relationships in this community – after almost two years (!), my family has settled in happily and are looking forward to continuing to do so. Professor Darryl Heller, is one of those wonderful community contacts. His is a specialist on Black-Jewish relations and will also be presenting on this topic for Adult Education in the Fall. This will be a worthwhile lecture to attend.

There is lots more planned for during my leave. Rabbi Michael Gilboa, husband of former member Emily Schoerning, will be our Interim High Holiday Rabbi and he will introduce himself to the community in next month's Bulletin. Eliana Light, a Jewish Educator and musician, will be our Scholarin-Residence for the days of Simchat Torah. She is really something special with an appeal to adults and children alike so stay tuned for some amazing, soulful, spiritual, musical programming to close the High Holiday season out with. And before you know it, it's November and you will see me walk the halls of the synagogue again, perhaps a little more bleary eyed than usual (though that too shall pass).

A special mention of gratitude should also go to Myra Clark who for the last few years has so beautifully maintained our synagogue gardens and brought us delight to our eyes.

As for me, by the time you read this Bulletin, I might have already gone on maternity leave (August 5<sup>th</sup> is my last workday and I will be back twelve weeks later). I hope to be able to report happy news (God willing, and puh-puh-puh and all that!) in a few weeks. I promise I will let the


### FROM THE STACKS ELLEN CAPLAN
